A fellow Montessori educator, Cassi Mackey, suggests we ask a different question... "What if after this we have created leaders who will heal our world and take care of our Earth. Our hope is that this will turn into a bright light in our world."

Like Maria Montessori, we embrace the importance of what our children have learned from home. We believe rather than falling behind, you have helped your children take advantage of a rare opportunity to learn and practice skills they will use for a lifetime – creativity, communication, critical thinking, independence, confidence and resilience. We've already rolled out safety practices for Summer with the intention of refining them for Fall.

These practices are based on the recommendations from experts and authorities and using our own common sense. We've published full documents on our practices that have been shared in a community email and posted on the Summer camp website pages.

We've divided the practices into 4 parts to make them easy to understand. The most important aspects are 1) make sure your camper is well when they come to camp 2) we have implemented a carline to decrease the number of people in the building 3) we are encouraging frequent hand-washing and 4) we have increased cleaning of high traffic areas.
